
Monet's Young life

Claude Monet's start to art



Above is Claude Monet's Impression, Sunrise.


Monet Moves

Michel Monet- March 17, 1878 to February 3, 1966.

Monet's Work

Claude Monet's first work of art was created in 1858. The piece was called View from Rouelles. The price of the painting is unmarked. Monet went to a Swiss inspired Paris studio when he started and met multiple other painters.



Claude Monet's Style

The art movement that Claude Monet is famous for is Impressionism. Impressionism is when someone paints with very thin, small, yet visible brush strokes. This creates emphasis on time, and natural light or structures.





Claude Monet's Style

Impressionism was used in the 19th century. It began in approximately 1860. Other artists that used this style were Pierre-Auguste Renoir, Edouard Manet, Edgar Degas, Paul Cezanne, and Henri Matisse.

This painting to the right is called Impression, Sunrise. This painting is located in Musee marmottan Monet. A museum.




Claude Monet's Paints
